<b>Nixle</b>	 <p>Text messages to cell phones for emergencies within your current location.</p>	Registration required. Visit <a href="http://MendoReady.org">MendoReady.org</a> to sign up.
<b>Mendo Alert</b>	 <p>Notification of emergencies via text, reverse 911 and email.</p>	Registration required. Visit <a href="http://MendoReady.org">MendoReady.org</a> to sign up.
<b>Social Media</b>	 <p>Posts regarding current events.</p>	Visit <a href="http://www.MendoReady.org">www.MendoReady.org</a> & County Facebook or X pages.
<b>Wireless Emergency Alert (WEA)</b>	 <p>Emergency alert to cell phones for emergencies within your current location.</p>	No registration required. Alert is issued by the County.
<b>Emergency Alert System (EAS)</b>	 <p>Alerts radio listeners, TV viewers and those with NOAA Weather Radios.</p>	No registration required. Alert is issued by County.
<b>Tsunami Sirens</b> <i>(Coastal Only)</i>	 <p>Alerts of possible tsunami threat.</p>	Coastal sirens sound alerting need to evacuate.
<b>Hi Lo Siren</b>	 <p>Alerts neighborhoods of an Evacuation Order using two-tone siren.</p>	Sheriff sounds Hi-Lo siren as they patrol neighborhoods during emergencies.
